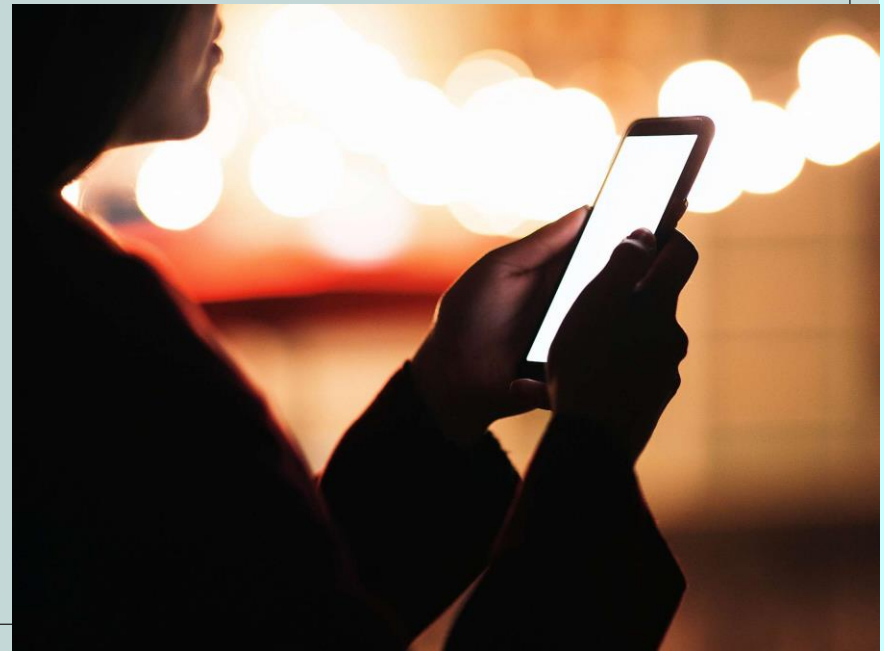


The Role of Artificial Intelligence in Cyberbullying

- Humorous videos of celebrities, athletes and political figures Deep Faked into dance scenes.
- Parents receiving Deep Fake phone calls from their sons and daughters asking for money, claiming they are in trouble and need help, etc.

2023-2024 School Year

- Non-consensual intimate imagery (NCII)
 - Any scenario in which intimate content is being produced, published or reproduced without consent.
- 39% of high school students report hearing about NCII
- Only 23% of teachers report the same

Center for Democracy & Technology

- 15% of high school students report hearing about Deepfake NCII
- Only 11% of teachers report the same

- 71% of teachers reported students caught were referred to law enforcement, expelled or suspended for 3+ days

- 10% of students report their schools provide resources to victims

Cyberbullying linked with suicidal thoughts and attempts in young adolescents

Participants who experienced cyberbullying were more than 4 times as likely to report thoughts of suicide and attempts as those who didn't.

Students who are involved in bullying and cyberbullying (both offenders and victims) have a significantly elevated likelihood of experiencing suicidal thoughts, suicide attempts, or completed suicide.
