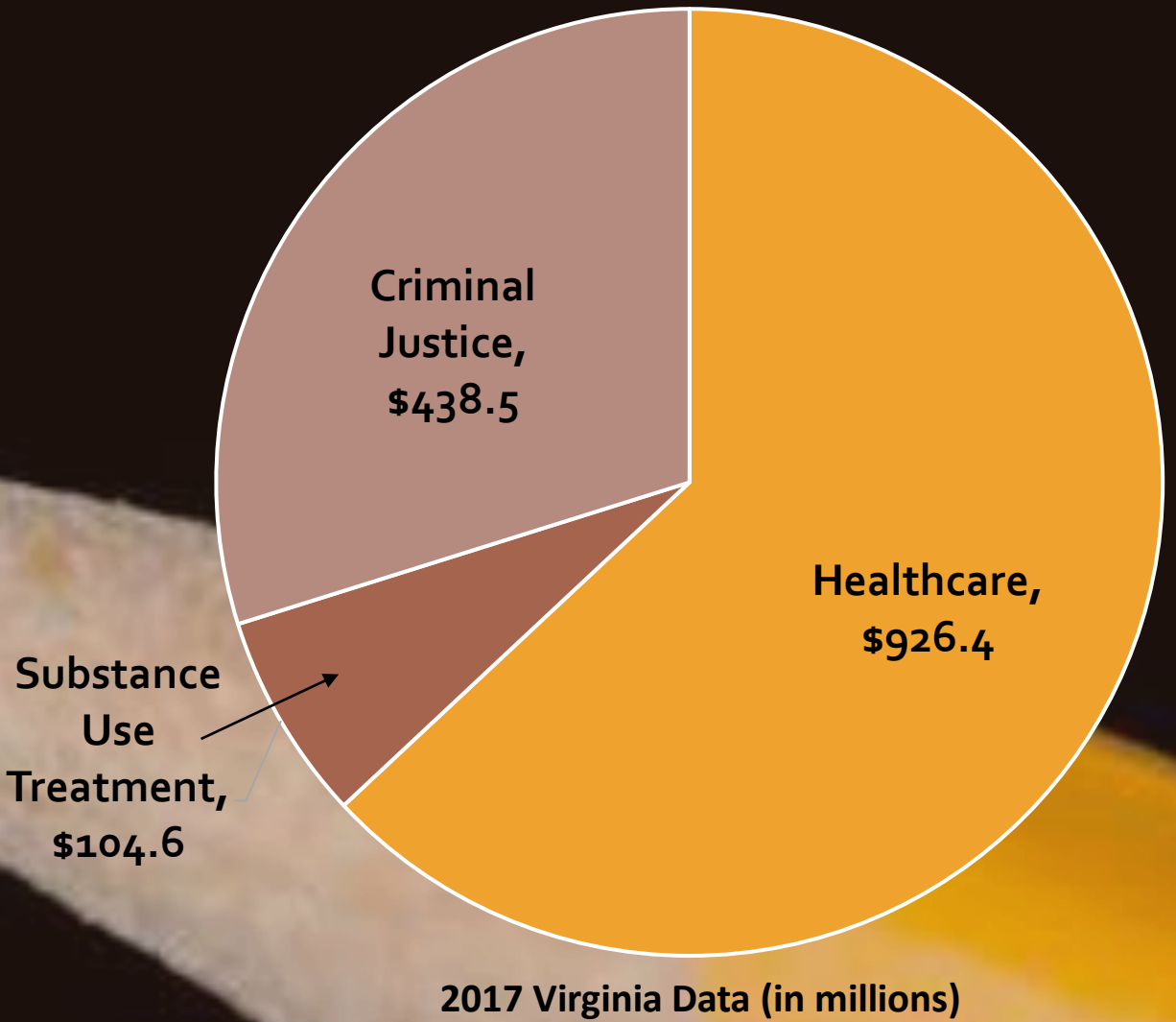

Fentanyl the deadly killer



- 150 deaths per day nationwide
- Comes in different forms, liquid & powder
- Distribution through social media
- 50 times stronger than heroin
- 100 times stronger than morphine



Illicit fentanyl versus other drugs

- Since 1999 this synthetic opioid has contributed to:
 - 106,699 overdose deaths among all genders.
 - 80,411 overdose deaths involving any opioid among all ages and gender.
 - 16,706 overdose deaths involving prescription opioids among all ages.



What more can we do to prevent fentanyl deaths?

- Narcan training – for State Employees (COOP, defibrillators)
- QR code visible at all State Agencies where the public visits DMV/DSS/CSB
- Banner for public websites – for ALL Agencies
- Mandatory training for all employees via the COVLC
- Narcan in first aid kits

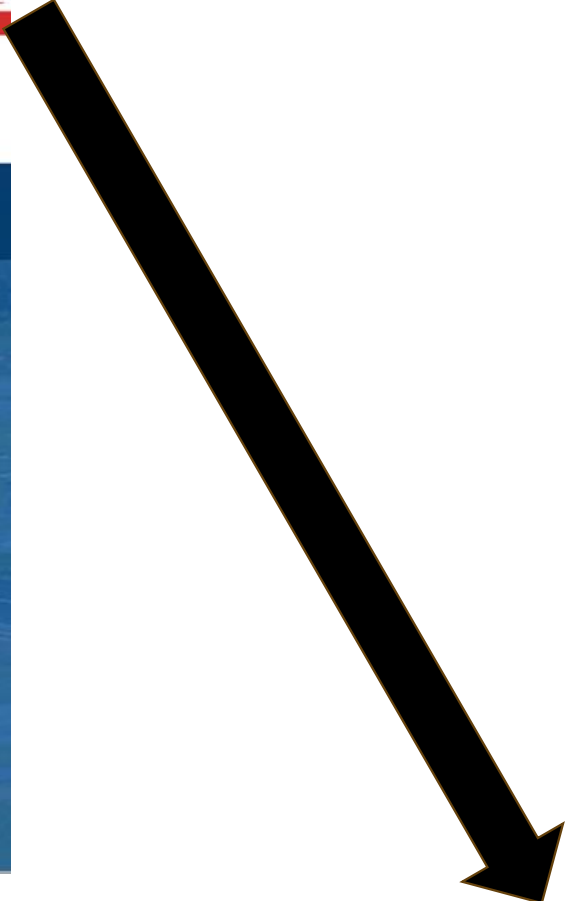
